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SCOUTS OF PERU YOUTH FORUM (PERU)

The Foundation provided financial support to hold the II National Scouts of Peru Youth Forum in February. The event provided training and tools to empower young people in youth participation and other important subjects.



JAMCAM OPERATION (BRAZIL)

During JamCam 2020, the Foundation helped to sponsor the Global Development Village and the “Better World” stand of the Interamerican Scout Region, with funding in 2019.



TTT LEADERSHIP COURSE (EL SALVADOR)

In April, the Foundation supported the Leadership Course (TTT), in El Salvador, the course strengthens young leaders and aims to help

them replicate this course in each of their countries in the Central American Subregion.



OUR COMMON HOME PROGRAM (BOLIVIA)

Our Common Home program, with the support of the Foundation, trains young Scouts to be environmental promoters. This program works to reach students in the formal educational system, encourages them to spread environmental awareness, and explains how to show commitment to the environment. Our Common Home program encourages young people to be agents of change in their community through small daily actions.

OPERACION AGUACATE (COLOMBIA)

The Foundation supported a community education effort in Columbia, in the ETCR (Territorial Space for Training and Reincorporation), where young scouts shared with the ex-combatant community the ways the Scout Movement can foster acceptance between people and can help in the peace process. Mariana Páez, Luz Marina and Alexander opened their home to these young scouts and fostered the program.

LEADERSHIP COURSE (NICARAGUA)

A National Leadership Course supported by the Foundation, was held in Nicaragua for young people between ages 17 - 21. The objective of the course was to provide tools for leadership and communication skills. The course addressed topics such as problem-solving, planning, and the development of community projects.

SCOUT COLOR FESTIVAL (BELIZE)

The IASF provided scholarships to young scouts in financial need to be able to participate in the Scout Color Festival where they were able to fully experience the Scout Movement.

PARK RECONSTRUCTION (URUGUAY)

A 15-year-old park was remodeled with the support of the Foundation to make it safe for children to enjoy for years to come. Reconstruction was completed by the founding members of the Armonia Scout Group.

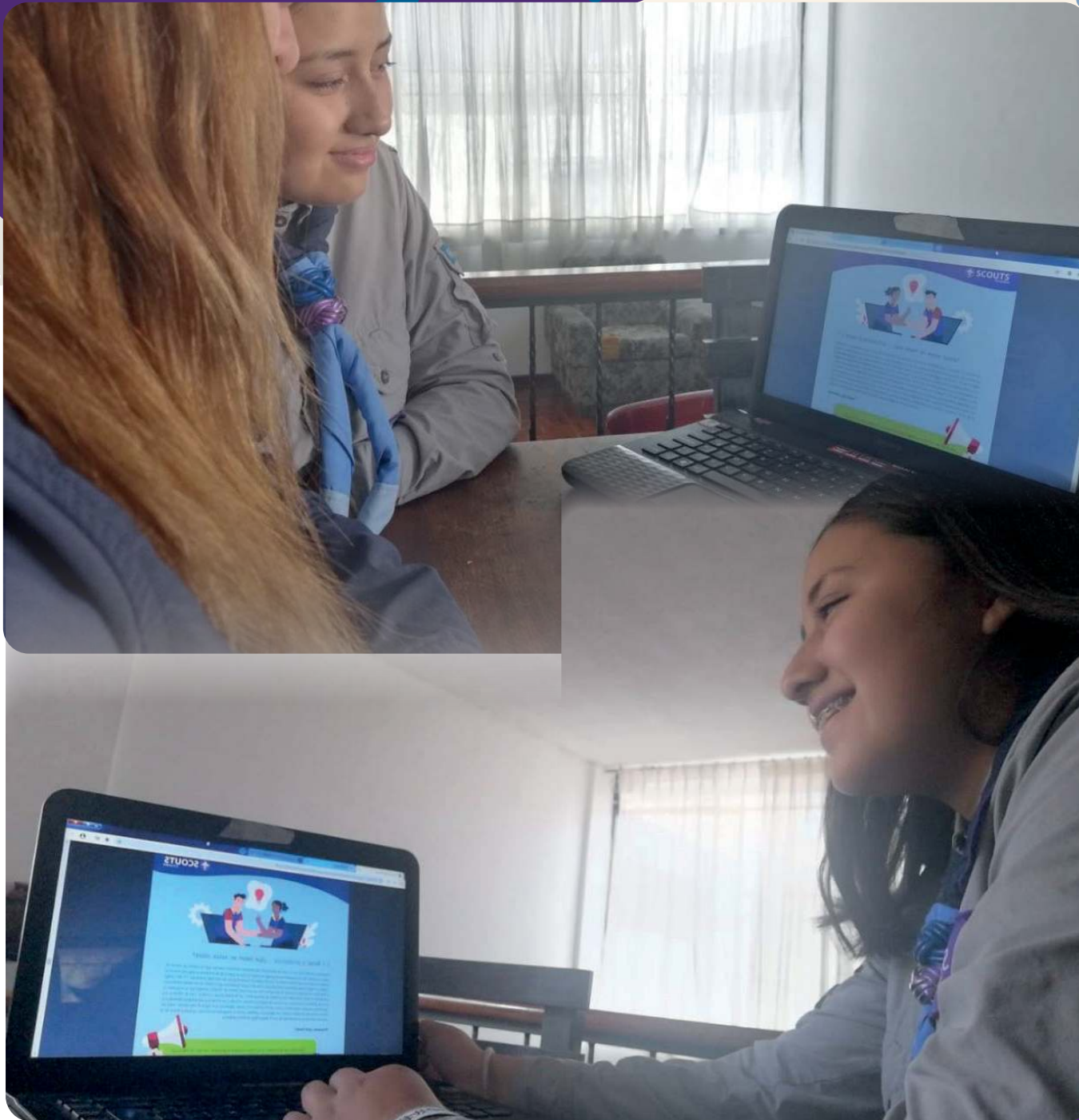
CYBER BULLYING (ECUADOR)

During the event, they participated in workshops and interactive discussions about the environmental crises that affect our planet. The camp was coordinated by a team of young Rovers, who since 2018, have been bringing the program for boys and girls into community schools.

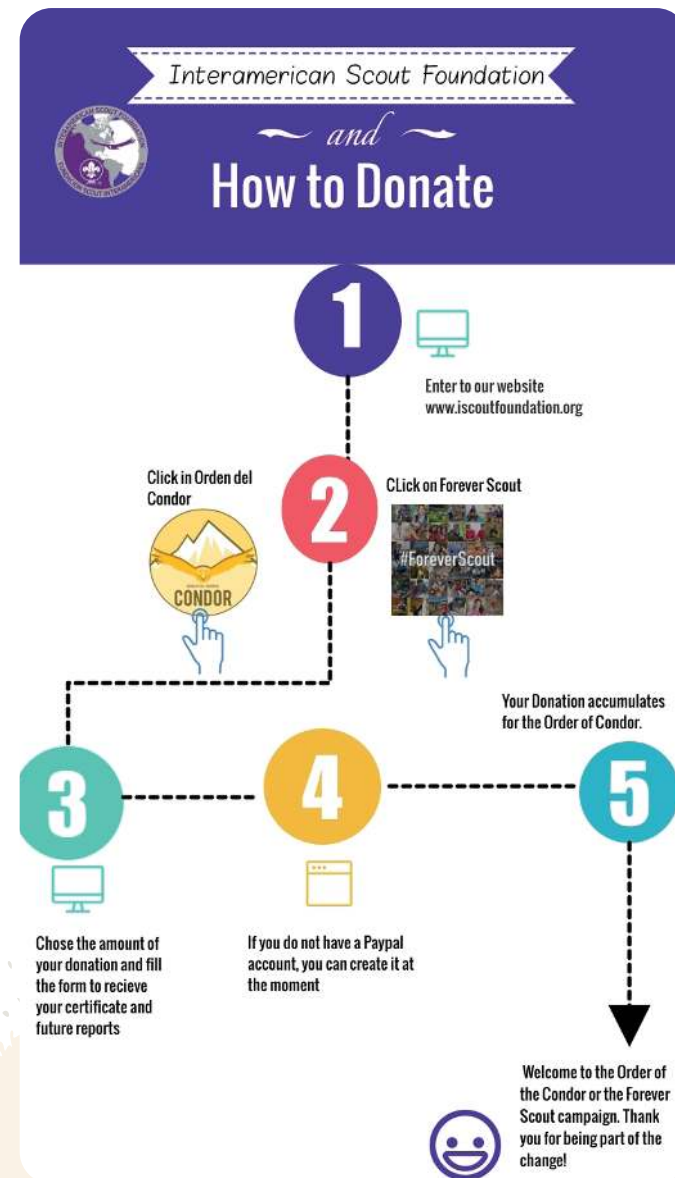

The meeting attendees were given the opportunity to participate in a fundraiser for the Foundation. IASF EVENTS

The IASF annual planning meeting was held March 9 - 10, 2019 in Panama City, Panama, with Raúl Sánchez Vaca, the Director of the Interamerica Support Center, Marcelo Guerra, President of the Foundation, and Juan Salvado, Executive Director of the Foundation.



The Federation of Scouting in Spain hosted the "Partnership Event" in Madrid, Spain, in April 2019, and the Foundation was given the opportunity to share its mission and projects. The objective of inviting a different region from WOSM was to discuss and exchange good practices for strategic alliances. The Foundation is happy to announce that five new members of The Order of the Condor were added at the reception with the Friends of Scouting in Europe Foundation (FOSE).





The Foundation had the privilege to participate in the Congress that Scholas Ocurrentes held in New York, New York, USA, in June 2019. The project “Our Common Home” was presented at this meeting. This project is carried out together with Scholas and has been adopted in Mexico and Bolivia, with the hope that it will be adopted in other NSO's.



IASF Executive Director, Juan Manuel Salvado, had the opportunity to present Foundation projects and the results of the “Our Common home” program at the International Catholic Conference of Scouting (ICCS) America, held June 22-23, 2019, in Argentina.

The Foundation provided a variety of different activities to highlight its mission and increase sponsorship at the World Scout Jamboree (WSJ), July 22 - Aug 2, 2019, in West Virginia, USA. One of the first efforts at this event was to raise funds for JamCam 2020 and to support vulnerable NSO's. To accomplish this a special badge was designed and made available during WSJ. The NSOs of Chile, Canada, Brazil, and Mexico made donations to the IASF through their “Food Houses” in an ongoing effort to help further the mission in the Region. Six new members of the Order of the Condor were also added during the event and we are thankful for their support of the Foundation.

The Foundation participated in strategic meetings at The World Forum on Non-Formal Education held December 9 -11, 2019, in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The event was created by the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) in association with more than 30 international organizations, which aims to explore how organizations can learn from the latest trends in non-formal education and take action for sustainable development. The Foundation held a reception where five new members of the Order of the Condor were added and participation in this event strengthened the visibility and sponsorship of its projects in the Region.
