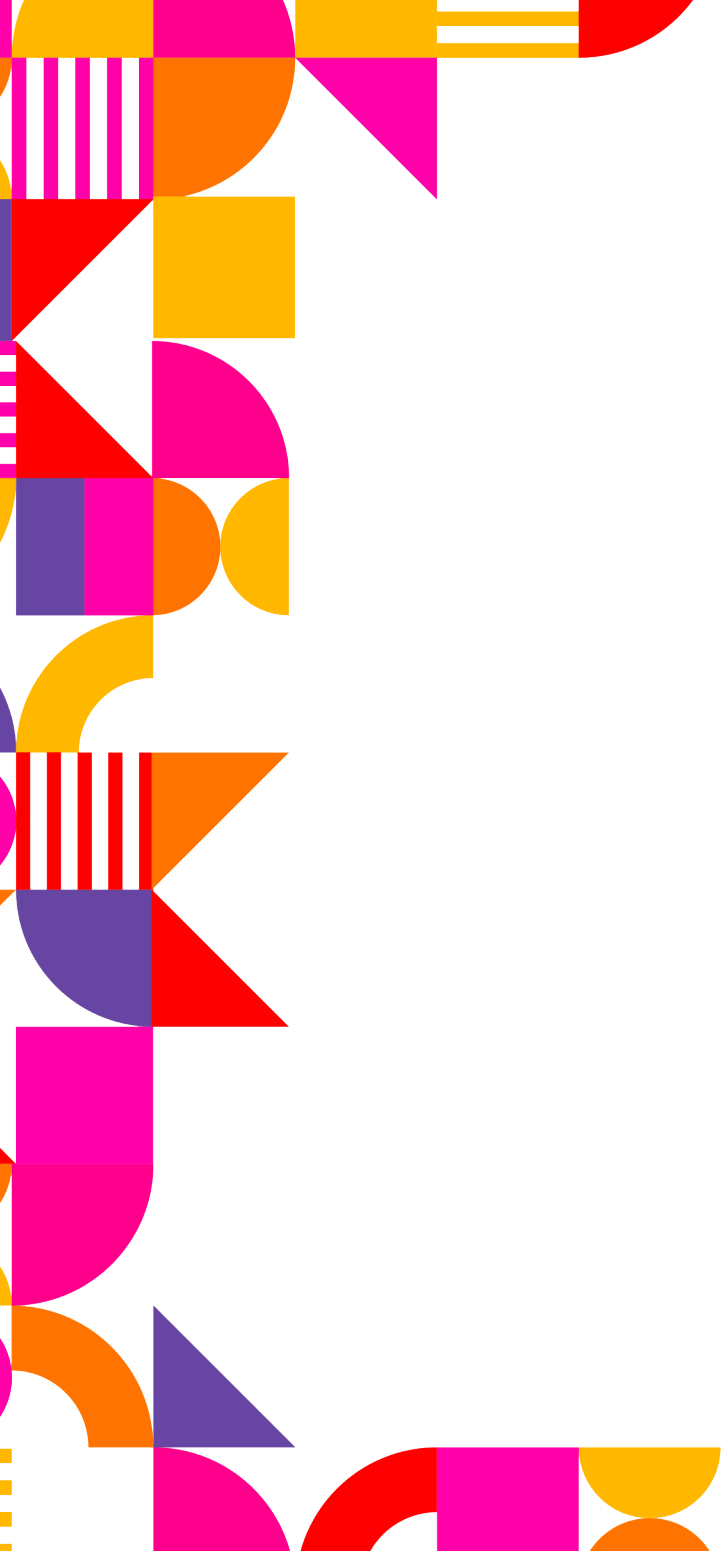

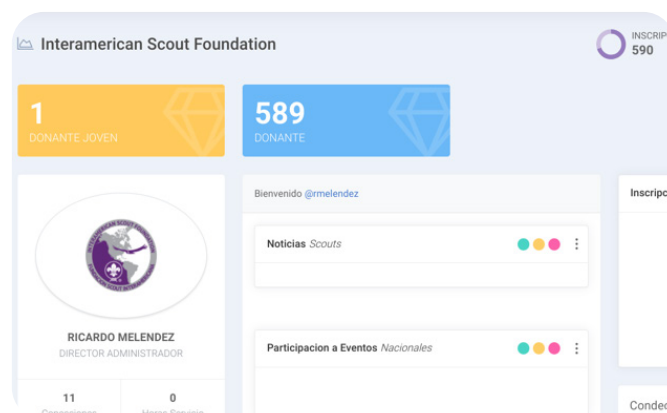

2021 Planning meeting:

March 2021 – Annual strategic planning meeting with the director of World Scout Bureau – Interamerican Support Center (WSB-ISC).

SOS Scout IAR 2021:

The Foundation has gathered USD 26,000 in support.



ILT Alumni & Friends Campaign:

We launched the campaign which targets “graduates from the Interamerican Leadership Training (ILT)”. The ILT is a course provided by young people for young people and since 2013, it has trained more than 1,000 leaders between the ages of 18 and 26, in different regions of the world. With this program, former ILT students and friends can help develop and hold future trainings to support NSOs who don't have the means or the infrastructure needed to organize trainings. The IASF continues to support and promote the growth of the Scout Movement in different countries and regions, training emerging leaders capable of expanding our scout values.

CRM SI Scout:

Support to the Digital Transformation Program of the National Scout Organizations of the Bahamas and El Salvador. SI SCOUT is a technological initiative developed to strengthen the NSO of the Interamerican

The IASF participated in the Annual Gathering of BSA international representatives and presented the work it has done all over America and the Caribbean. Five Orders of the Condor and two Orders of the Young Condor participated in this meeting.



Interamerican Scout Summit Presentation:

During the 10th Interamerican Scout Summit, the Foundation did a presentation to inform about its advances and projects that culminated at the time.

Annual Board Meeting:

During the session, the new Trustees were introduced (Audrey Oakes, Tico Pérez, John Reid, Phillip Zabriskie, Efrén del Valle, Pratik Vaidya). Additionally, the new 2022 officers were selected. The board also supported the new budget and project allocations for 2022, displaying their support for the executive management team.



Projects supported during 2021:

Regional Spiritual Development Workshop – Interamerican Support Center (ISC):

As established by the Regional Plan 2018-2021, the Foundation provided support to the ISC to carry out specific activities to strengthen or include spirituality in the NSO Youth Programs. The Regional Spiritual Development Workshop significantly contributed to the training of several different NSOs and provided updated materials and best practices on the topic.

Strengthening of the Institution:

The Coronavirus pandemic led to a publicly acknowledged situation of need. Donations received for this purpose allowed the Foundation to assist several NSOs, such as the ones in Santa Lucia, Jamaica, and Mexico, and make sure they were able to meet their regional commitments throughout 2021. By doing so, the Foundation provided support to institutional strengthening in times of crisis.

The Scout Association of Trinidad and Tobago – Imaginarium:

More than 300 young Scouts took part in the virtual Jamboree. The event addressed different aspects of the holistic development of children, active citizenship, modern relevance, and self-sufficiency.

Scout Association of Argentina – “Warm and Donating” Active Communities

The IASF provided support to Argentina Scouts (NSO) and the program they created to provide warm clothing to vulnerable groups of people during the winter season, as well as in their more than 100 blood donating drives held all over the country. The Argentinian Health Ministry acknowledges the work done by Scouts to get people involved and increase awareness of the need to donate blood.



Dominican Scout Association – Solidarity with Haitian Scouts:

The Dominican Scout Association helped collect and purchase basic camping equipment to support the population affected by the earthquake that occurred in August 2021, which was then delivered to the Haitian border and helped more than 300 people.

Scout Association of Ecuador – Specialization and Skills Fair:

During the pandemic and the fact that in-person gatherings were discouraged, the Foundation provided support to Scout Teachers, as well as children and young people of all ages in Ecuador. This project



was developed as a virtual alternative to motivate children and young people in Ecuador to pursue specializations and develop new skills.

Guide and Scouts Association of Chile – Scouting and Guiding Without Borders:

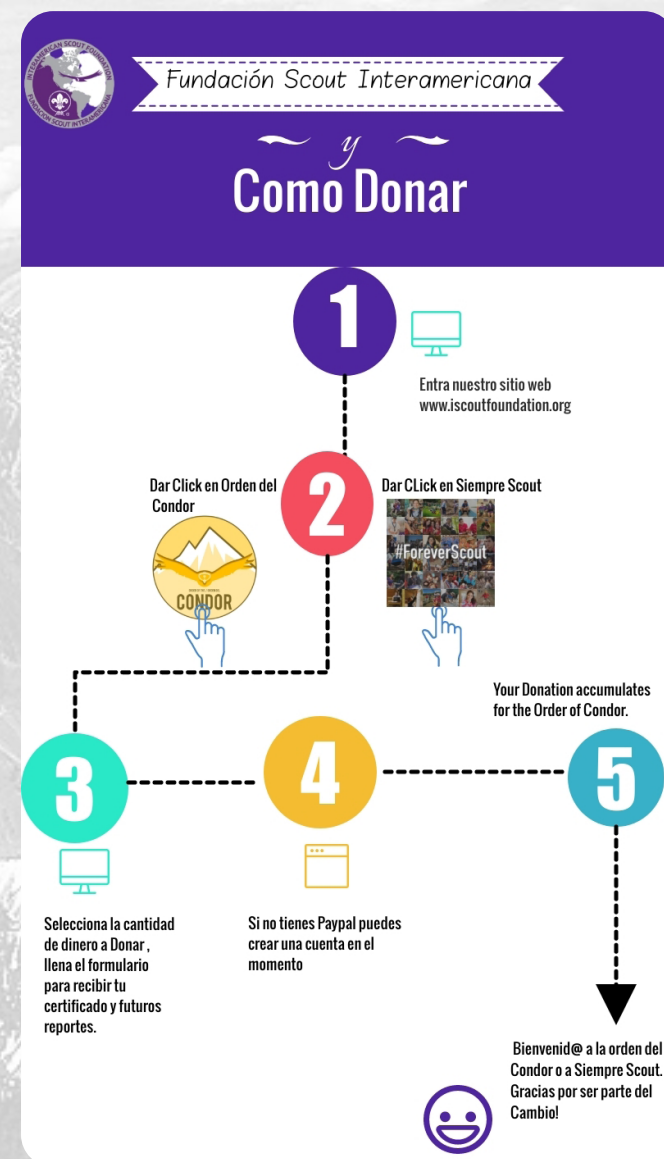
Due to an increasing trend of migration to Chile, the Foundation supported cultural activities in more than 13 areas of the country, to ensure a harmonious integration of over 250 members.

Institutional Development

In this section, the Interamerican Scout Foundation (IASF) reveals the impact achieved during 2021 in terms of contributions and economic support provided to the World Scout Bureau Interamerican Support Center (WSB-ISC) operational performance. These results were possible because of donors and collaborators that seek to generously support the region. Thank you!

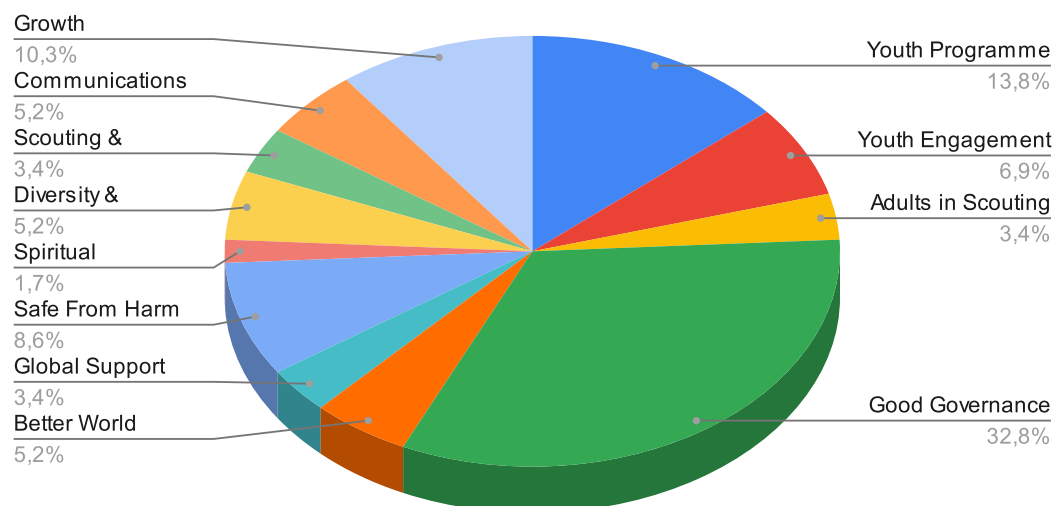
During 2021, a much larger number of NSOs have benefitted from the service model of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), after getting direct support from the consultant pool trained in 13 service areas.

From the time the Model was first launched in 2018 until the end of 2021, 180 services requested by 77% of the NSOs in the region were provided.

58 new services were requested during 2021. These were divided into:

38% of the services requested in 2021 are currently in progress (in 2022), 29% of them were completed and closed, 14% are under review and will be closed soon, 10% were paused and 9% were canceled before completion.



Each of the services delivered has contributed to strengthening the processes NSOs have set in the region. This is evidenced by the internal processes and documents that have been updated during this time as well as the training received by adults in every single service area, and an improvement in the quality of the results achieved in every area, all of which are aligned to the strategic objectives set by both the Regional and the World plan.
